Bethany Church (Rumford, RI) will be here for a special service on Sunday night, April 24! The teen worship team will lead us as a part of a special evening of activities. They will also tell us about a work and witness trip they are planning and will share their testimonies with us. We will take a love offering for them that evening.

Annual Meeting—April 24 AM and PM

As you know, the administrative structure of the Church of the Nazarene is a hybrid democracy. The congregation, in cooperation with the district leadership, calls a pastor to offer leadership to a local church body. The local church congregation elects a church board and departmental leaders to work with that pastor to shape and support the ministry on an annual basis.

Once each year, there is an annual meeting at which formal church members elect leaders for the congregation and ratify the annual budget proposed by the Church Board. This year, that meeting will happen on April 24.

Before the morning service begins, voting will commence in the lobby of the church. It will conclude about fifteen minutes after the service ends. A report booklet will be published which contains information from the various church leaders as well as a copy of the proposed budget.

In the evening, there will be a short town hall type meeting where questions will be taken regarding the proposed budget. In addition, after the meeting we will participate in worship with the Bethany Church teens, followed by a short missions lesson. We will enjoy a pot-luck meal together after the event is finished.

One other note: Formal membership is held by all those who have applied to become members and have taken the pledges required for such a step. Associate members are those who worship here regularly and have pledged themselves to cooperate with the general principles and ministry of the church. "Friends" of the church are those who worship here regularly, but have not taken the steps to become either formal or associate members. In our eyes, everyone who attends here is a member of our family, and is loved, appreciated and treated in the same manner. In terms of the laws of the State of Connecticut and church law, however, only those who are formal members of the religious corporation may vote in the business meetings of that corporation.
