Capital Improvements Funds Offering

From 2011 through 2014, we were blessed to have offering totals high enough to be able to pay for our capital improvement expenses from our saved funds and budget surpluses. We have watched God work in exceptional ways recently, allowing us to complete major renovation projects: Two new roofs, a new HVAC system and controlling system, new carpet on the first floor of 218 Main Street, new phone systems, new furnaces in the McLain building and the 44 Sterling Place parsonage, an expansion and new roof at 44 Sterling Place, to mention just a few of the larger project. These projects were necessary, and in some cases, a long time overdue.

Since 2014, our weekly giving has decreased and, given that we have spent our reserve funds on all these projects, we no longer have the funds to pay for capital expenses out of our operations budget. Consequently, we need to raise some revenue for the capital expenses we will need to address this year.

MCN owns two parsonages in which our pastoral families live. Possessing these two homes is a great financial boon to the church. Rather than paying the parsonage families a certain amount of money to acquire housing each year, the church provides a benefit in the form of homes that are already owned by the church. This saves the church between 25 and 30 thousand dollars each year.

While the savings that these homes provide is very significant, ownership also means that the church must protect its investment by maintaining and periodically upgrading the homes it owns. The parsonage at 232 was upgraded with new counter tops and painting when the Whitneys moved here in 2011. In addition, a fire in the kitchen of that home resulted in a kitchen upgrade in the 1980s. The parsonage of 44 Sterling Place has not had a similar upgrade (and thankfully, no fire!).

It is time for us to take on some important upgrades and repairs to these two homes. The attached list is provided to give focus to the needed repairs/upgrades. In addition, there are several other projects that are not parsonage related. We would encourage you to pray about this list in the weeks ahead. It may be that you would like to pay for one of the items on the list, or partially fund one of the options. It may be that you have the skills to provide the labor to install or upgrade the listed item, if someone else can provide the materials. It may be that you will simply contribute generally to these projects as a part of your ongoing support of the ministry of Manchester Nazarene.

Most of all, we'd like to ask you to take along one of the description sheets and take it before the Father in prayer. He is the one who has used us so many times in the past to accomplish the goals He has set before us. We are confident that, as we all do as He leads, that this need will be more than met.

We will receive this special offering next week, and every week until Pentecost Sunday. Please use the red envelopes for this offering, and be certain to write any instructions you may have on the envelope for the sake of recording.
