Special Stewardship and Debt Reduction Emphasis

Quoted from The Treasure Principle by Randy Alcorn

John D. Rockefeller was one of the wealthiest men who ever lived. After he died someone asked his accountant, "How much money did John D. leave? The reply was classic: "He left ... all of it."

Jesus takes that profound truth "You can't take it with you" and adds a stunning qualification. By telling us to store up treasures for ourselves in heaven, He gives us a breathtaking corollary, which I call the Treasure Principle:

You can't take it with you—But you can send it on ahead.

It's that simple. And if it doesn't take your breath away, you're not understanding it! Anything we try to hang on to here will be lost. But anything we put into God's hands will be ours for eternity.

If we give instead of keep, if we invest in the eternal instead of in the temporal, we store up treasures in heaven that will never stop paying dividends. Whatever treasures we store up on earth will be left behind when we leave. Whatever treasures we store up in heaven will be waiting for us when we arrive.

Current Year beginning April 1, 2018

A balanced budget was passed for the church fiscal year that begins 4/1/2018 and ends 3/31/2019. We are projecting tithes and offering at \$9,000 per week, the same as last year's budget, but a level that will only be achieved with increased giving. In addition to the challenge of getting tithes and offerings to the \$9,000 per week level, this does not adequately fund capital expenditures which have been mostly handled by reserve funds that are nearly exhausted. With debt service at 25% of our budget expenditures and 5 years left on the mortgage we decided the best course of action was a campaign to present information to the congregation on Christian Stewardship, promote an increase in regular weekly giving and raise \$300,000 over the next two years to pay off our mortgage. The Board approved and the congregation voted 95% in favor of the Christian Stewardship campaign. The church leadership has pledged \$162,140 toward debt reduction and the congregation is being challenged to match that amount.

Whoever loves money never has enough. Whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. As goods increase, so do those who consume them. And what benefit are they to the owner except to feast his eyes on them? The sleep of a laborer is sweet, whether he eats little or much, but the abundance of a rich man permits him no sleep. I have seen grievous evil under the sun: wealth hoarded to the harm of its owner. Or wealth lost through some misfortune. Naked a man comes from his mother's womb, and as he comes, so he departs. He takes nothing from his labor that he can carry in his hand. (Ecclesiastes 5:10-15)
